BEACON LIGHT— INDUCTION ICING

Most airsmall planes built prior to 1996 are equipped with carburetors. That innocentlooking little black white knob. usually 10cated adjacent to the

throttle, so often gets ignored when it is just about the most important control of the moment when the engine begins having an unexplained loss of power. Iøm babbling about the carburetor heat control. Iøve seen so many pilots imitate a broken-down windmill with arms flailing to everything else within reach and still not pull the carburetor heat õonö. Some pilots have said, õWhen the pilot cooler up front stops, it sure gets hot in the cockpit and makes you sweat.ö

The source of heat is fire passing through the engine exhaust system of thin sheet metal tubing made of stainless steel. When the engine stops, within about 20 seconds this thin metal will cool enough that it will not be very useful for melting ice. You had better be quick to Use It or Lose It.

The primary function of the carburetor heat system is to eliminate or prevent ice formation in the carburetor venturi and

on or around the throttle valve. This system provides an alternate source of induction air if you collide with some kides party balloon, a kite, a layer of butterflies, mosquitoes, blades of grass or mud or hit a rain shower during freezing conditions and the water freezes in the air filter.

Remember, the carburetor heat system has no air filter, soí dongt spend all day taxiing with the carburetor heat õonö, unless you want the engine to ingest about half of the dirt and sand on the airport. (Woody wants to keep some of it.) The engine overhauler will love to have your business. Most of these systems are designed to increase the induction air temperature about 75°F.

Most manufacturers recommend the carburetor heat be applied up to one minute before power reduction for landing approach and applying engine power prior to turning õoffö the carburetor heat to assure an adequate flow of warm air so ice does not have a chance to form on or around the throttle valve.

Fuel injected engines are subject to stoppage due to induction air filter obstruction by objects mentioned above. These installations have a spring-loaded door that opens inward when the pilot pulls the õalternate airö control or manifold pressure becomes low enough to create a suction force strong enough to pull it open.

Enjoy the cooler weather!
