WILDLIFE HAZARD

When I talk about wildlife hazards, I am not referring to wild women! Animals that may be hazardous to flyers include birds, deer, other mammals and even some reptiles. Anything large enough to cause serious damage on the ground or in the

Everyone knows that there are such hazards; how do we avoid them? Here are some suggestions:

- 1. Avoid flying at low altitudes except for takeoff and landings.
- 2. Avoid flying over areas such as lakes and beaches at low altitude.
- 3. Prior to departure, check the facility directory or NOTAMs for information regarding migratory wildlife for your destination.

- 4. When landing after dark, get advanced advice from the airport regarding possible wildlife on or near the runway.
- 5. If practical, fly down the runway with all lights on to see if it is clear. Dongt fly too low.
- If flying often at night, install landing light systems/ bulbs that provide better illumination of the landing area such as the LoPresti Boom Beam.
- Land and slow down (reduce your ground roll) as quickly as possible without using excessive braking or causing other problems. Use aerodynamic braking when landing at night for the shortest ground roll. By slowing down to an appropriate taxi speed, the chance of causing damage due to an animal running out in front of you is reduced. In fact, I have never heard of a wildlife strike during taxiing.
- 8. On airports where this is practical, taxi down the runway before takeoff from opposite the departure point.
- Ask personnel on the ground to make a run down the runway to inspect for wildlife prior to landing.

Although, I have never hit or been hit by anything other than birds, I have come very close. I remember landing at Lake Charles many years ago and having a very large alligator on the runway which could have caused extreme damage. Also, in Long Beach, California, there were huge jack rabbits all over the place. Believe me, one of these 20-pounders could do substantial damage to your plane.

Recently, there was a deer strike to a customeros aircraft while landing at West Houston Airport. The last deer strike I recall and/or that was reported at West Houston Airport was in 2003 and before that in 1998. Our own planes, which fly more from/to West Houston Airport than any others, have never sustained any damage from deer on our airport. Bird strikes in flight at other locations, however, are common. Itøs a risk and unpredictable.

Be aware of this hazard and take precautions wherever you go. Fly safely!
