While there are many reasons people come to Houston, one of the most notable is that MD Anderson gives patients the best opportunity to beating cancer. As a command pilot for Angel Flight, I regularly fly patients from the Valley in south Texas, San Angelo, and many other places to Houston to receive medical care. The reason I do this is because in many cases, it makes the impossible possible. Many are too sick for a 12 hour car drive to Houston, a number are immunocompromised due to chemo and other treatments that they need to minimize exposure to many other people on commercial flights, and some simply don't have the funds. By donating my time, plane and fuel, I make the impossible possible. Instead of receiving the 'standard of care' at a local hospital, they can avail themselves of the best care available in the U.S. and perhaps



the world. Over my 200 Angel Flights, I've heard many stories and one most common one goes essentially like this, "I was diagnosed with cancer and received treatment at the local or regional hospital. After they said there wasn't much more they could do for me, I was able to get into MD Anderson and have been receiving treatment that has extended my life. I thought receiving treatment at MD Anderson wouldn't be a possibility given the distance, but Angel Flight has made this possible." While it does not seem like much to us pilots that fly regularly, for many, getting to the place where they can receive the best medical care becomes a difficult task, especially when the normal routine is a trip to Houston every couple of weeks for another round of chemo, etc. Half the cure is getting there.

I'm reminded of many cases, both those that beat cancer, and those that fought valiantly and passed. I think of a brain cancer patient from the Valley whose wife lovingly helped him get into the plane and who sent me a short text after a few days in Houston telling me how fortunate they were to get to MD Anderson when they did. I think of a chemical plant worker from Louisiana who worked hard and diligently his whole life but who is now receiving treatment at MD Anderson. I think of a young boy who was a burn victim that I flew from New Mexico to Galveston (one of the best burn centers in the U.S.), to receive ongoing treatment for his burns. While I only flew the son and one of his parents, his entire family (all his brothers and sisters and his grandparents) came out to the airport to wish him well. I am also reminded of a patient that I flew who I could take his mind off his illness for a moment and engage him in a discussion on how everything worked in the aircraft. It was just a couple of hours of distraction, but these respites are a blessing for those facing serious medical issues. He was engaged and excited about learning something new.

For me, I enjoy a flying challenge. That is why I generally fly those missions that are not picked up by other pilots because the weather is beyond that which they are comfortable with. When I take a mission, I try to figure out how to complete it while giving the patient the most comfortable ride possible, whether that is flying above the weather, around the weather, or changing the time of the mission a few hours to let the weather settle down. That said, other Angel Flight pilots take the easier missions. We all contribute in our own way. In return, we not only receive the deep personal appreciation of the patients, but also get to deduct the cost of fuel in completing the mission for tax purposes and the rental of the aircraft if we don't own it. In addition, many FBOs, and most notably West Houston Airport, provide a very substantial discount in their fuel prices as their way of supporting these flights. Woody Lesikar and West Houston Airport give back to the community by facilitating these flights at a lower cost than would otherwise be possible. At the same time, these flights help me to keep my skills sharp. If you don't use them, you lose them.

Angel Flight South Central is open to any pilot that has over 200 hours and who has access to a plane. Some command pilots only fly one mission/yr, whereas the average is closer to 7-10 missions/yr. The average aircraft is a Cirrus, but Angel Flight has pilots who fly everything from a Piper Cub to a TBM 900 or a Citation Jet. Whatever your aircraft and your ability, your participation is much appreciated by the patients. Angel Flight is also a very efficient charity. Over 95% of every dollar contributed going to providing patients with the transportation they need. While we cannot boast the effective flight schedule of a Southwest Airlines that only flies one type of aircraft and has the same skill level of all their crew, Angel Flight is proud of its ability to get over 80% of the patients who need to travel to their destination. The range of aircraft and pilot capability reminds one of the rescue at Dunkirk; demonstration of what the average sailor, fisherman and sport boater could do when they worked together. 




West Houston Airport Amendments to Rules

Effective May 1, 2025

- After start up at terminal ramp, taxi out to runway do not continue to hold at terminal with engines running for prolonged time. Pilots and passengers are boarding other planes!
- No stop and go landings. Only full stops with taxi back and or touch & go's.
- No taxi into position and wait. Not a safe op at this nontowered airport.
- Helicopters shall be good neighbors to surrounding residential areas or will be prohibited from using IWS.
- Helicopters shall not hover on the runway or do stop and go's on the runway. No skid marks accepted!
- Based helicopters shall use the grass runway for practice.
- Helicopter pilots: Be professional, courteous and safe. If you can't follow HAI helicopter rules, don't come here. Area Residents are important to us!!!
- Helo's do not park on main taxi ways.
- No helicopter training flights and no night ops except based and transient to the parking area only.
- No right hand traffic except in a declared emergency See "Best practices and traffic pattern procedure for fixed wing and Helo's.
- Do NOT fly low with high RPM's over residential areas.
- Use runway 15 as the prevailing runway when winds of 5 knots or less, unless unable due to pilot qualifications.
- Caution noise sensitive areas to the north through west of the airport.
- Maintain traffic pattern close in and high over residential areas. Don't be a noise maker!
- Do NOT place prop control in high RPM over residential areas!! Wait until very short final.
- Do NOT say "clear of runway" until completely clear of the hold line!!
- Do not loiter on the runway while rolling to exit. Keep your taxi speed up but safe!
- Use PAPI lights or approach procedure minimums when landing at night to avoid obstructions.
- Give a minimum of one hour notice for in/out service and MORE if possible. Remember the name of the CSR.
- Be specific as to your fuel requests. Keep track of your CFR or Lineman's name for future reference.
- Explain special towing procedures or remain with your aircraft for oversight.
- Do not block access to the runway threshold for other aircraft while running up or receiving a clearance, move across to other side or preferably pull over to run up area and allow others to pass.
- Report FOD to airport CSR, Security, or Manager.
- When departing runway 33, turn left as soon as safely possible after departure to a heading of 300 degree, which is a flight path over the Bear Creek, a procedure to avoid major residential areas.
- Do not fly straight out with max RPM after departing runway 33 except in emergency. Not Good!
- Do not fly over airport hangars or the terminal building. This goes for helicopters also! Be professional!
- No straight in approaches when other planes in the pattern. If two or more planes are in the pattern get in line Don't expect others to give way!
- All landing, taxi, pulse, beacon and strobes on in the traffic pattern, no exceptions!
- Report positions in the traffic pattern. Use IWS "Best Practices Traffic Pattern Polices".
- No 360 degree turns in the traffic pattern!!

Except in a declared emergency. Violation of these airport rules may terminate your use of the airport. We want to do all we can for our patrons but those that don't want to be patrons, please let us know. For further information on details contact Airport Manager, 281-492-2130.

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


