With summer approaching and the heart energy making itself evident by bumpy-air turbulence and cumulus clouds, we need to be ever watchful for thun-

derstorms of all sizes. They are not very neighborly and can do us and our airplanes some very destructive harm.

Many airplanes have suffered over-stress wrinkling, hail damage and all the way up to complete destruction in mid-air. If you are not in a cumulonimbus stay out of it. If you are in one – get out of it promptly as possible and slow the airspeed to "well below Va (Maneuvering speed). I prefer to slow to the upper end of the white arc so the impact with shear current is not so high. Continued (page 3)

### HELP STOP FAA AIRSPACE GRAB!

RE: FAA Airspace number 14-ASW-5, Send a Message! FAA is proposing a class "D" airspace up to 2700 MSL around the Houston Executive Airport (TME). This is not an acceptable solution!

This proposal, if implemented, would squeeze East/West – West/East bound air traffic to unacceptable levels, just below the class "B" airspace. Please sign petition at IWS Terminal, indicating your objection to the ceiling of the class "D" airspace as proposed at 2700' and that 2000' is acceptable and safer. In order to obtain public input, the FAA will host two informal public meetings.

This is my 50<sup>th</sup> year flying so I think I have earned the right to critique the FAA.

It has been my policy over the years not to give out any information over the phone.

This is the same policy that the government has toward me. Ask them for the information and you won't get any. Ask for a name and you will get lucky to get a nick name. After we hung up, and just for my own interest, I asked the two planes that were just landing if they had come from the Hooks Airport area, and both said they had not. Now what if I would have given that controller the "N" number? I WILL NOT BE FAA'S scape goat! To all you incompetents working at the Hooks Tower --- Don't call here for anything ---- EVER! If you don't have those government issued stabilized binoculars, then put in a request. If you can't see those big "N" numbers on the side of airplanes that you required then don't expect others to do your work for you! No Tattle Tales Here!

One out of 100 FAA employees will help you and work with you. Do you think that one will be the one you are about to talk too? GET REAL!



Hail can be encountered up to 20 miles in any direction from the center of the trunk. If hail is out in clear air, the light refraction through the hail will make the air appear to be a pale pea green.

Wind shears may be present both inside and outside the cloud, microburst being the worst in close vicinity to the core of the shaft and spreading outward up to 3 or 4 miles. They usually occur just before the rain shaft from the base and lasting 3 to 5 minutes. Microbursts are invisible.


