

AIRPORT COURTESY LEADS TO SAFETY

Below are a few suggestions concerning courtesy among pilots. We are all part of the same community. Courtesy and respect toward our fellow pilots leads to better communication and safety for all of us.

Don't be a Space Hog when operating on the surface of an airport. Try to avoid aiming your propeller blast in another airplane's face. Direct your blast diagonal to the taxiway edge and away from all runways and over the grass where it will only annoy the bugs and worms. When possible, make engine run-ups close enough to the edge of the taxiway or run-up pad to permit another airplane to pass.

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When holding for an IFR Clearance or Release, avoid blocking other aircraft for a prolonged period of time. If

you expect any significant delay, try to make space that will permit other aircraft to pass.

When executing an IFR Approach, avoid radio reports, such as "Passing Orent" or "Passing Atila." These names are meaningless to most VFR pilots. They will be more likely to understand a report such as "5 mile final to 15 on GPS Approach" or "4 miles northeast on VOR Delta Approach."

UNICOM RADIO ABUSE includes, but is not limited to:

- a. Failing to monitor the CTAF frequency for a couple of minutes to learn the current traffic flow, instead of "requesting airport advisory."
- b. At non-towered airports there is no authority to grant a clearance to "line up and wait." This is an improper call at non-towered airports. A better call would be "departing 15." This would identify the entire procedure.
- c. No Stop and Goes at IWS. Okay with Touch and Goes.

Airports located in Class G or Class E airspaces, such as West Houston Airport, have established left hand traffic patterns unless they have approved light signals or visual markings indicating that all turns should be made to the right. FAR 91.126(a) and (b) and 91.127.

When departing from an airport that has left turns and you wish to turn-out to the right, wait until at least one mile from the departure end of the runway and at pattern altitude before making a right turn out

The Aeronautical Information Manual (AIM) recommends, after takeoff, climb to within 300 feet of the traffic pattern altitude before making any turn.

Radio position calls in the traffic pattern are best made immediately before or during the entry to a turn into a leg. This helps focus the other pilots' attention on that location and they can see your airplane better when you present a larger profile than will be the case when your wings are level. This report would be "turning crosswind for 15" or "turning downwind for 15," etc.

Among the rude radio calls would be "...is 17 miles out. Anyone in the pattern, please advise" (as if they had some controlling authority). If they would only listen for a minute or so, they would know if there is possible conflicting traffic. Imagine if 5 or 6 pilots suddenly began responding to such a call. It would be bedlam.
