

## IWS AIRPORT PILOT ETIQUITTE FOR SAFE OPERATIONS

Use Clear and on the point language and phraseology. Do not call for a radio check. Rather call for an airport advisory.

Do not delay in taxiing out from the terminal ramp. Crews and passengers are transiting that area and would appreciate courteous consideration of their safe passage.

The use of strobes, beacons and landing lights while in the traffic pattern is a safe procedure.

Stay on centerline of the runway when taking off. Avoid runway lights! Runway 15 is our preferred runway and should be used when winds are less than 5 knots and when no other traffic is present either taking off or landing on Runway 33.

When departing runway 33, as soon as safety allows and practical for your departure, turn left to 310 degrees, flying over the Bear Creek to avoid noise sensitive areas.

If flying certain aircraft such as Bonanzas, Cessna 180's, 185's, 206's, T-6's, and other aircraft similarly configured, depart using a maximum of 2500 RPM's or when unable, bring back RPM to 2500 or less immediately after lift off. In circumstances where you are unable to operate with reduced RPM's, avoid all residential areas when departing. Use of the best angle of climb to 1000 feet or higher will also distance the airport from noise complaints pertaining to your flight.

Helicopters avoid all residential areas in vicinity of IWS at all times.

Do not block either parallel taxiway while performing the preflight checks. Use any adjoining taxiway located on the west or east side for run up instead of blocking other taxiing or departing aircraft.

Do not "hold" on runway waiting for clearance or for another aircraft to clear.

Use the special frequency 129.875 for requests from outside of the airport traffic area from long distances. This is a private advisory and communications frequency, similar to Unicom. Example: "West Houston Airport, West Houston Airport, Cessna 123B, checking in to see if you have the Hertz Rental car for Mr. Adams, over." (example aircraft is 17,000 feet 100 miles out). Or, "West Houston Airport, West Houston Airport, Cessna 123B, this is Randy at D2 hangar, please call my office and let them know I am running thirty minutes late.

Do not say "clear" of the runway unless passed the hold line. Use of terminology "clearing" instead.

No stop and go's. Full stops with taxi back or touch and go's only. Do not come to a complete stop on the runway and or stop moving to exit the runway. Someone could be behind you and traffic at IWS is such that sitting on the runway is unsafe.

Obtaining an IFR clearance is not a clearance for take off at a non-towered airport.

When departing the airport indicate direction of flight and altitude; An example is: "West Houston traffic, Cessna 123B departing to the west, climbing through 500 feet."

Receiving a "cleared for the approach" is not a clearance to land. Approach control cannot clear you to land at a non-towered airport.

Pick up your IFR clearance on the ground on 121.15, not in the air. You can also pick it up by phone if the remote FAA transmitter located on the airport is out of service. The phone number for clearance delivery is 888-766-8267.

Close IFR flight plans in the air when the landing is assured or on the ground on 121.15. VFR flight plans must be closed in the air or by phone.

Straight-in's must give way to all other traffic in the pattern even if on IFR. Being IFR does not mean you have priority or privilege over VFR traffic.

When approaching the airport, monitor Unicom on 123.05 at least ten miles out or when released by approach control. Use **your "traffic page" of your GPS with range setting down to see** local traffic in the pattern. Use the AWOS to get weather 125.575.

No right hand patterns at IWS. Right turns in the IWS traffic pattern are against the FAR's and Advisory Circulars.

Emergencies take priority over everything and everybody else.
